Exchange students can take courses across departments/schools, and it depends on whether a student meets the prerequisites for a course or if a course is open to all students. Please note that courses in Mathematics and Computer Science are very popular and difficult to get into.

#### On-campus Housing

Exchange students have the option to apply for a room in NYU managed residence hall, NYU housing is not guaranteed. Students who are requesting to live in the residence halls may submit the housing waitlist application and will receive information on their enrollment portal after admissions on how to apply. Residence halls offered to exchange students vary from apartment-style with shared kitchen areas to traditional hall style, although most will be placed in apartment-style housing.

- On-campus Housing: \$6,100 - \$12,900 per semester
- University meal plans range from \$2,214 to \$3,143 per semester depending on the plan.

Upon admission, international exchange students must complete a DS-2019 application to apply for a J-1 visa. International Student Orientation is scheduled for mid-September (students will be given information through their enrollment portal). The NYU Office of Global Services (OGS) will assist you with any questions regarding requirements for student visas. Admitted students will be required to provide a copy of their valid passport and documentation showing financial support. Students should check with their own consulate regarding the cost of their Visa to the USA.
